HARDY HIBISCUS
Rose Mallow

Characteristics

Hardy Hibiscus is a marshland native of the eastern U.S.

This old –time favorite is a shrub like herbaceous perennial that range from 4-8’ tall at maturity and offer huge plate-size flower (8-10”) in a range of pinks, reds, and whites.

Fantasia	Huge 8” wide,ruffled flowers with a red eye.	3.65gal/13.8liter
Jazzberry Jam	Huge 9” wide, deep magenta flowers with a red eye	3.65gal/13.8liter
Kopper King	Gigantic flowers are white with a red eye that bleeds out through the veins	3.65gal/13.8liter
Lady Baltimore	5-6”wide, ruffled ,pink blooms with a red center and deep throat	3.65gal/13.8liter
Lord Baltimore	Huge10” wide, ruffled, crimson-red flowers	3.65gal/13.8liter
Moy Grande	Huge rose-pink flowers	3.65gal/13.8liter
Peppermint Schnapps	Large 8-10”pink flowers with reddish –pink veining and bright red eye	3.65gal/13.8liter
Pink Elephant	Pink flowers with overlapping petals and deep red eye	3.65gal/13.8liter
Torchy	Huge 12”carmine blooms	3.65gal/13.8liter

Quality Standards:

All plants will arrive in a #12 pot with color picture tag. Hibiscus in the pot should not be allowed to dry out. Allowing them to wilt could result in lower leaf yellowing and bud abortion. Once established in landscape Hardy Hibiscus is considered drought tolerant.

Approx. Length of Life:

Variety dependant, will begin blooming in mid-summer with some varieties lasting until frost.

- Rudbeckias

Customer Care Instructions:

Hardy Hibiscus need to be planted on a southwestern site (afternoon sun), and will break dormancy when soil temperature is around 50 degrees , around mid-May.
